Each year, around 10,000 young people in England aged 16-25 leave local authority care. These young people face huge challenges and considerable vulnerabilities as they move into independence without the support of close family.

Established in 2018, The National House Project is a charity which provides support and expertise to local authorities across the country to set up Local House Projects for young people leaving care. Around ten young people work together to develop a community of support and create homes they can potentially live in forever. This includes applying practical skills likes decorating and making curtains, as well as learning to cook, budget and make household decisions.
