Key points for 2023/24 tax year

- Personal allowance remains at £12,570 (the standard tax code for PAYE will be 1257L).
- The higher rate tax threshold stays at £37,701 for tax at 40% and the upper rate threshold for 45% tax reduces to £125,140. Different rates and thresholds apply to Scottish taxpayers.
- The dividend allowance reduces to £1,000 & dividends will be taxed at 8.75%, 33.75% and 39.35% respectively.
- The savings starting rate allowance of £5,000 (ie taxed at 0% if within this) continues to apply if your total taxable non-savings income is less than £5,000. If you're in the basic rate band, you will receive a £1,000 personal savings allowance for interest and £500 if you are in the higher rate band.
- The capital gains tax exempt amount reduces to £6,000.
- Pension limit increases to £60,000 with the lifetime allowance removed for the time being.
- Employment allowance increases to £5,000 and is only available to employers with an employer's national insurance bill of less than £100k for the year ended 5th April 2023.
- VAT threshold continues to be £85,000.
- Corporation tax rates increase to 25% for profits in excess of £250,000 there is a small profits rate of 19% for profits less than £50,000 and a marginal rate applicable between the two profit levels. For a group of companies these profit limits are divided by the number of non-dormant companies.
- Capital allowances The annual investment allowance stays at £1m. There is a 'full expensing' (no limit) relief for qualifying expenditure assets must be new and used by the company ie not hired. Integral features will have a 50% deduction where they qualify under the same rules.
- The writing down allowance remains unchanged at 18% on plant & machinery, 6% for integral features and 3% for the structures and buildings allowance.

R&D

1st April 2023 brings changes to the R&D scheme with a reduction in the additional deduction for SMEs (less than 500 staff & turnover less than 100 million Euros) from 130% to 86%; but for the RDEC scheme (available to all company sizes, but generally aimed at larger companies) – will have an increase in the taxable credit rate from 13% to 20%.

In addition the SME tax credit will stay at 14.5% for loss-making SMEs where 40% of their expenditure is on R&D, but is reduced to 10% for other SMEs.

What does this mean?

So if you are a profitable SME you were receiving 130% additional deduction on a 19% tax rate ie saving 43.7p per £1 of expenditure. Under the revised rates you would get an additional deduction of 86% on a 25% tax rate, ie saving 46.5p per £1.

If you're a lossmaking SME, you were claiming the repayable tax credits, you would get 130% additional deduction, & get a credit of 14.5% repayable ie 33.35p per $\mathfrak{L}1$.

Now the scheme gives an 86% additional deduction but providing your R&D is 40%+ of your cost, the credit will be at a rate of 27p per £1 (or if less R&D intensive 18.6p per £1).

Other changes

Additionally the R&D claim process is being tightened up whereby the categories of qualifying expenditure & details of the R&D activities need to be disclosed with the claim. Claims have to be endorsed by a named senior company officer. New R&D claims require the company to pre-notify HMRC in advance that they are making an R&D claim within 6 months of the end of the period to which the claim relates.

Details of any agent advising the company in making the R&D claim must be disclosed.

Updates and Reminders

PAYE

Employee payroll records and your payroll software needs to be updated from 6th April, or earlier if your software provider asks you to;

Employees should receive their P60 by 31st May.

Personal Tax

You should receive a notice if you are required to file a tax return for 2022/23 shortly after 5th April 2023; Second payment on account for the 2022/23 tax year is due by 31st July 2023.
